These programs are proven to increase physical and emotional well-being in students. They learn to reduce stress, increase focus, regulate their feelings, and more. When students learn these practices at a young age, they are better equipped to face future challenges, avoid risky behaviors, and support their peers.

HIGH SCHOOL: LINK CREW COORDINATOR

TRAINING for two teachers, who will coordinate student Link Crew Leaders. Crew leaders help other students with the difficult transition from middle school to high school.



New students learn to navigate a new environment, gain a sense of belonging, etc. Crew leaders learn mentoring and leadership skills, and, in turn, also feel a more integral part of the school community. A win-win situation for all!

The total cost for these wonderful programs this year is nearly \$11,000!

This is in addition to the ongoing programs and events we support. Our current budget does not allow us to fully fund all of these.
