Last year we identified growing concern over the emotional, physical, and social wellness of our student body. To address this, we made a commitment to allocate resources towards developing a new initiative to address these areas through proactive, protective measures. We are excited to share these programs with you during the coming year as they unfold.

It is an exciting time to be at the helm of this dynamic organization. Our fourteenth year in operations looks very promising. We are excited to have appointed Kristy Atkinson as our new community mobilizer. We also have many new faces on our prevention board and volunteering on our many active committees. 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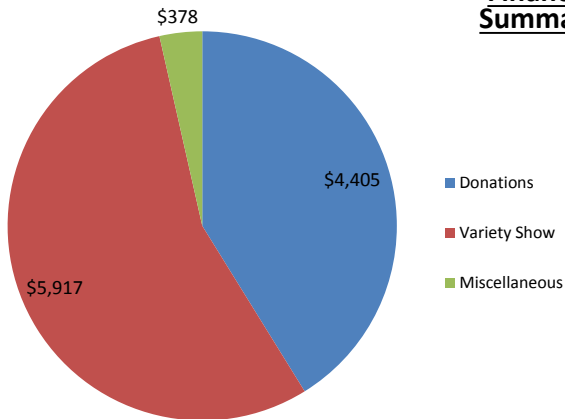
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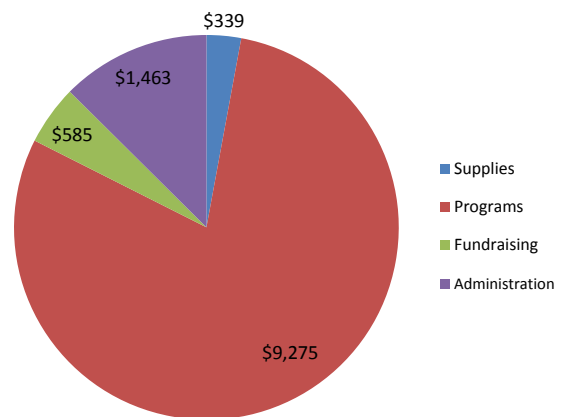

The following programs are supported by YSCTC in an effort to increase the positive factors in our community that serve to protect our youth from risky behaviors.

Big Brothers Big Sisters

The Big Brothers Big Sisters Smart Program pairs high school and middle school students with an elementary aged student in order to provide bonding opportunities and skill building.

Middle School and High School Student Boards

Middle School and High School Student Boards provide bonding and problem solving opportunities among students of varying social groups to gain a greater understanding and tolerance of others, while gaining leadership qualities to bring about positive change.

Cathy Shaffer Above & Beyond Awards

Cathy Shaffer Above & Beyond Awards provide bi-annual recognition of those students in our community who exemplify the mission of YSCTC.

New Family Inclusion

New Family Inclusion is a program which provides information and support to ease the transition for new families coming into York Suburban School District.

Kids in the Kitchen

The Kids in the Kitchen program brings skill building, nutritional education, and fun to elementary aged children.

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National Night Out

Our National Night Out participation provides support as we work to foster the relationship between law enforcement and our community.

Community Variety Show

The Pennsylvania Youth Survey is given to 6th, 8th, 10th, and 12th grade York Suburban students every other year. CTC evaluates the data from this survey to determine the risk factors facing our youth, and establishing programming to protect them.
