YSCTC Makes a Difference

Perhaps the most practical way of explaining YSCTC is by listing a few of the activities we support: Big Brothers Big Sisters, Wellness Night, Multi-Cultural Festival, Forum on Opioid Use in Our Community, Middle School Advisory Board and High School Advisory Board. CTC also administers the PAYS (Pennsylvania Youth Survey) data surveys and we work with York Suburban Administration to address the immediate needs in our schools.

YSCTC is not a program of York Suburban School District. However, we do work closely with YS Administration to support the ongoing needs of students and families in the district. Our relationship is specifically focused on responding to data collected through PAYS. The data provides a starting point for addressing alcohol and substance use, juvenile delinquency and crime, and healthy alternatives to unhealthy behavior.


